The plan for discussion section: The main purpose of section is to discuss examples that illustrate the concepts from lecture. We'll do problems on the board, as well as some individual/group practice problems. We'll also go over some of the more challenging homework problems. In general, I will not repeat material from lecture, except to ocasionally provide a different perspective when I think it's warranted.
